II Corinthians 9:15 Thanks be unto God for his unspeakable gift.

II Corinthians 9:15 Thanks be unto God for his unspeakable gift.

Paul calls it his unspeakable gift.

It was around this time of the year, 1974, that I received this unspeakable gift. It was the greatest thanksgiving and Christmas time I ever experienced.

Now I have been saved for 44 years. I was 21 years of age when I received Christ's gift of salvation. It can become easy to take this gift for granted the longer we are saved.

But think about what He did for us.

Why is it such a great gift?

Colossians 1:13 Who hath delivered us from the power of darkness, and hath translated us into the kingdom of his dear Son:

Colossians 1:14 In whom we have redemption through his blood, even the forgiveness of sins:

We have been delivered from the kingdom of Satan and the power of darkness. We have been translated into the Kingdom of God.

There are a lot of people in Satan's kingdom of darkness and for them there is not much to be thankful for on thanksgiving.

Think about what it took to deliver us from the power of darkness, from satan's grasp.

***I. It took Jesus, the eternal son of God, coming to earth and taking on flesh and living a perfect life in this world of sin degradation and temptation.***

## ***II. JESUS OFFERED UP HIS PERFECT LIFE AS A SUBSTITUTE FOR OUR SIN.***

He did not sin.  
He could not sin.

Yet Satan and his people crucified him and offered him up on the cross..

The wages of sin is death.  
Jesus never sinned.  
So He had to take our sin upon Himself or even on the cross He would not die.

All the pictures in the Bible illustrate what He did.

THE SACRIFICES, from the garden to the New Testament, all the lambs that were offered were a picture of Him.

## ***III. JESUS DIED AND WAS BURIED AND AROSE AGAIN.***

It was not in His death that he defeated Satan.  
It was in His resurrection.
